Allyson Sonenshine has 25 years of nonprofit, legal and volunteer experience in women's health. In 2011, she founded the Orange County Women's Health Project, a nonprofit dedicated to advancing local women's health through education, collaboration, and advocacy. Prior to the OCWHP, she was an attorney in Los Angeles and subsequently helped establish the SOS-El Sol Wellness Center in Santa Ana. She is the past Board Chair for both Essential Access Health and Planned Parenthood of Orange & San Bernardino Counties. She graduated with honors from the University of Pennsylvania and earned her JD at USC School of Law.

### **DENA RUBIN, MPH**

### **Program Manager, Orange County Women's Health Project**

Dena Rubin has over 30 years of experience developing and managing health and human service programs in California. Ms. Rubin has supported the OCWHP with addressing women's health priority health issues since 2014. Sandra R. Hernández, MD, is president and CEO of the California Health Care Foundation, which works to improve the health care system so it works for all Californians. Prior to joining CHCF, Sandra was CEO of The San Francisco Foundation, which she led for 16 years. She previously served as director of public health for the City and County of San Francisco. She also co-chaired San Francisco's Universal Healthcare Council, which designed Healthy San Francisco. It was the first time a local government in the US attempted to provide health care for all of its constituents. In February 2018, Sandra was appointed by Governor Jerry Brown to the Covered California board of directors. She also serves on the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing Advisory Council at UC Davis and on the UC Regents Health Services Committee. Sandra is an assistant clinical professor at the UCSF School of Medicine. She practiced at San Francisco General Hospital in the HIV/AIDS Clinic from 1984 to 2016. Sandra is a graduate of Yale University, the Tufts School of Medicine, and the certificate program for senior executives in state and local government at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government.

# NICHOLE QUICK, MD, MPH County Health Officer, Orange County Health Care Agency

Nichole Quick, MD, MPH is currently County Health Officer for the Orange County Healthcare Agency. Dr. Quick is board certified in General Preventive Medicine & Public Health, and Addiction Medicine. She completed a preventive medicine residency at the University of California, San Diego and received a Masters of Public Health from San Diego State University. Prior to joining Orange County Health Care Agency in August, Dr. Quick served at the Public Health Officer for Yuba County in Marysville, CA, overseeing the Health & Human Services Public Health Division.
